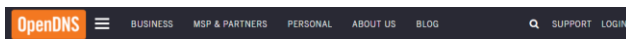

Phishing Attacks – Protect your students and yourself!

With two well publicized attacks in May, this has been a big month for phishing and ransomware. Phishing attacks 'fish' for user information through some sort of scam and ransomware locks user's files suggesting that if they pay a ransom the files will be unlocked. The May 3 Google Phishing scam appeared to be an innocent Google Document share, but when users logged in it sent a quickly spreading message to everyone in the user's contact list. Google shut this down within an hour, but not before 1M individuals were affected. While Google was the target of the first, Microsoft was targeted in the second attack. Specifically users who had not been running regular updates. While waiting for Microsoft updates can be time consuming, please make it a priority to run these as they are vitally important to the security of your device and the networks you join. 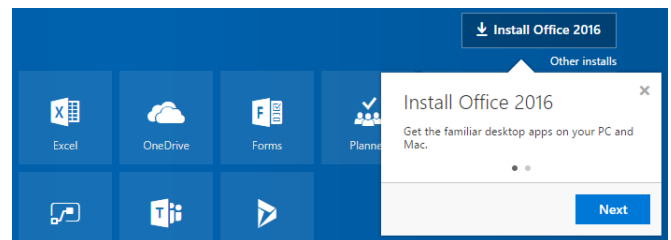

Microsoft Office for Students

All EGRPS students and staff members now have access to download Microsoft Professional Plus as well as use Microsoft Office 365 Online. To access this software, students can log in to <https://portal.office.com> using their @egrps.org username and password. Under the heading "Install Office 2016 on your PC", you will find an "Install now" button. You can use this button to install Office 2016 on up to five (5) of your personal Windows and Macintosh devices. We recommend unchecking the "Make Bing your search engine" and "Make MSN your browser homepage" before clicking the "Install now" button.



At the same address, our students also have access to Microsoft Office 365 which is the online version of Word, Excel, and PowerPoint accessible via a web browser. This software works very similar to Google Docs. You can store documents in the Microsoft cloud and reach them from any device with access to the Internet. The district will continue to standardize on Google Docs and do not have plans to change to the Microsoft product as our district platform. We view this Microsoft Office Pro and Microsoft Office 365 opportunity as providing additional tools which may be helpful for our families.
